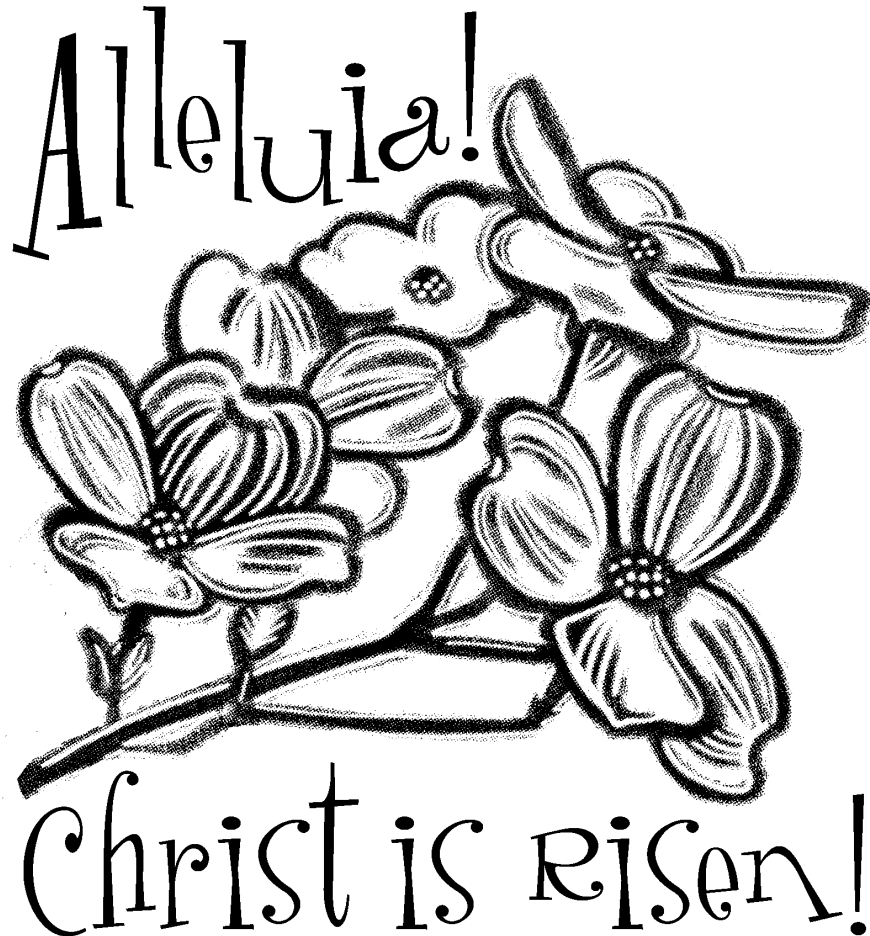

Examining the reality of how we work

Synod assembly vote on by-laws, constitution to reflect this

Advent works in the ministry of the larger church through the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. This year ELCA churches in the Metro area are meeting June 21-22 in Leesburg for the annual gathering. This year's theme is "Praying, Discerning, Renewing" and agenda items include the election of a new synod bishop; Bishop Graham has said that he is willing to serve a second term. Other things on the agenda include the elections of synod council members and other officers and approval of the budget. The Shape of the Synod Task Force has been working on changes needed to the constitution and governing structure so that the documents reflect the reality of the way that things are now being done (just as we are doing at Advent). The Assembly will vote on by-law changes to reflect this. The Assembly will hear about next steps in the Malaria Campaign, a church-wide initiative to raise money to eliminate malaria. It will also vote on various resolutions brought to the floor of the Assembly by people in the churches, such as one on gun violence. This year's ELCA representative will be The Rev. Mark S. Hanson, ELCA presiding bishop, who will bring greetings and news from the church-wide ELCA and assist with the election.

house and by the phone (re-searching, of course, every closet and tub). Marie asked the police if they had seen the children, and they replied that their colleagues had them at the corner of Cameron Station Blvd. and Duke Street. They had turned right out of the building because they had decided to walk to the library. A neighbor near the corner had seen them waiting to cross Duke Street (!!!) and called the police. When Marie arrived, the neighbor left, so we don't know who this lady was who appeared at the right time and did the right thing and then disappeared. Little Lucas was wearing a police coat and Emilie was wrapped in a sweatshirt. They, of course, didn't realize they were cold. The police gave them a ride home, then also disappeared.

The following Tuesday (the day it was 90 degrees outside), I was in a meeting with a couple of other pastors in a coffee shop. I began to feel unwell but not in pain, became disoriented and had trouble concentrating. Then I got lightheaded and my colleagues thought I should go home, so I stood up. The next thing I remember is lying on the floor of the coffee shop, vomiting. They called Wendell and 911. Both arrived post haste. I was severely dehydrated. Wendell provided information and support while the paramedics did their jobs professionally and kindly. My colleagues cleaned up the area and got me water. Then they all disappeared, leaving Wendell to take me home.

I've seen a lot of the Risen Christ so far this Easter. I hope you have too.

Highlights from the March meeting

- * The 23rd Street churches are planning two events: a service project for July 13; and an all-day event of food, fun and music on September 14.
- * Expenditures exceeded receipts by \$1,121 for the month of February and \$964 year-to-date. Overall, General Fund expenditures year-to-date are about 5% under budget, while income is about 7% under budget.
- * Finance Minister Rensford Lovell reported that the Mission Investment Fund allows changes to be made once a year. A recalculation of the loan can be requested but the interest rate will remain the same.

The balance in the Capital Campaign Fund is \$55,190.

A motion was approved to pay \$60,000 to the Mission Investment Fund (\$55,190 from the Capital Campaign Fund and \$4,810 from the Building Transformation Fund).

- * Property Minister George Toth had the stained glass windows in the sanctuary inspected. They are in good shape - no leaking around the frames, the cement between the glass pieces is not cracked or peeling, and the structural integrity of the four windows is intact. The outside protective windows are also in good shape but are slightly yellowed, which shifts the color rendering inside.
- * The average attendance for February was 41.
- * A motion was approved to appoint David Falksen as Financial Secretary.
- * A motion was approved to discontinue allocating any monies to the Interest General Fund and move any monies to the General Fund.
- * A motion was approved to increase the wages of Gladys Aguilera to \$100.00 per week effective April 1, 2013. Ms. Aguilera cleans the church.

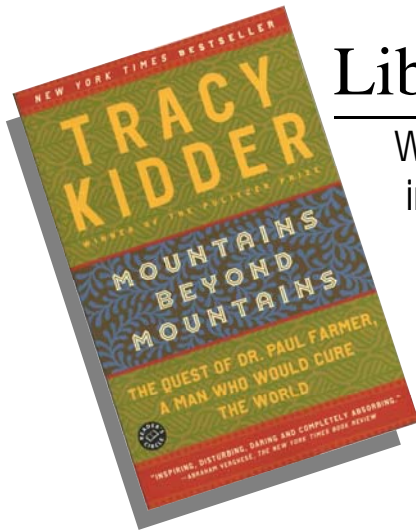
Many hands keep our garden beautiful!

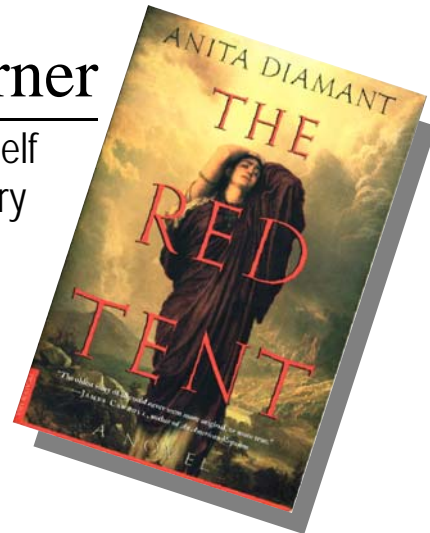


Mountains Beyond Mountains

... a historical novel written by Anita Diamant, tells the story of Dinah, the daughter of Jacob and sister of Joseph. Diamant expands upon Dinah's story as written in the Bible, focusing on the role of the "red tent", in which Dinah bonded with her mothers, aunts, and cousins through song, gossip, and storytelling during their menstrual cycles and childbirth. Shortly after its release, the novel grabbed the attention of many women by offering a glimpse into the lives of women during Biblical times. The book has been acclaimed for recreating an ancient life with caravans, shepherds, farmers, midwives, slaves, and artisans.

Book drive aims to enrich lives of African students

The books will be donated to Thokozani Brothers, a choral group of about 300 kids from one of the townships near Capetown. 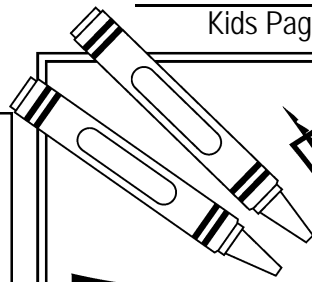


these days.

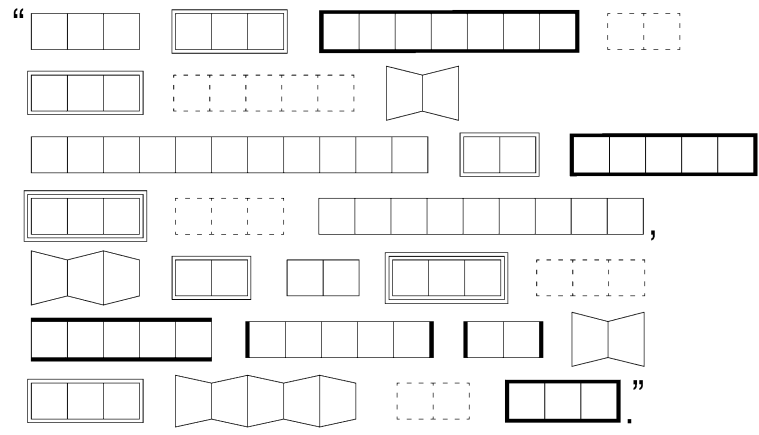
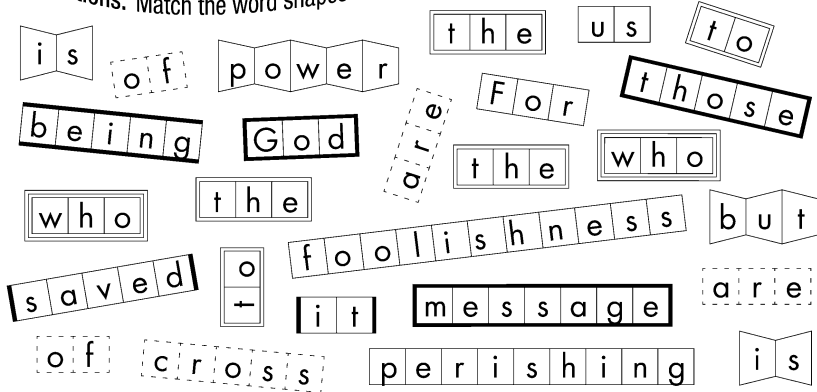

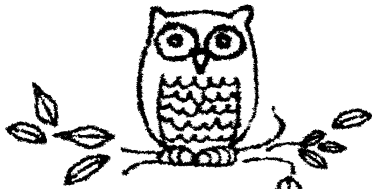
TO BE FOOLISH -OR- WISE

A WISE SNACK

Believing in the message of the cross makes you wise. This treat is a great reminder to be wise in God's ways.

What you need:

- Slice of whole wheat bread
- Circle cookie cutter (or jar lid)

- Nut butter (peanut, hazelnut, etc.)
